EVWD ALERTS THE COMMUNITY OF SCAM TELEPHONE CALLS

The District is urging the community to be cautious of unsolicited phone calls attempting to collect banking or personal information

HIGHLAND, Calif., (April 12, 2019) – East Valley Water District takes pride in protecting the community from scammers by alerting residents of potential fraud. The District has been made aware of an unknown vendor attempting to collect credit card information over the phone by impersonating the District.

When the call is received, the Caller ID shows “East Valley Water” from phone number (909) 280-8130. This is a tactic called “spoofing” to manipulate the Caller ID so that it appears as a legitimate call. The person or robocall then requests credit card information to reduce credit card interest rates. If you receive a call like this, do not provide banking information and hang up.

As precautionary measure, the District has temporarily suspended courtesy payment reminder phone calls and is asking customers to contact the office directly at (909) 889-9501 to make a payment. The District believes these are typical fraudulent telephone scams that target residents by posing as utility agencies. Often, scammers access contact information through the internet or public records.

East Valley Water District does not believe customer personal information has been compromised as no legitimate account information is provided during the call. Telephone scams are an ongoing threat to utility agencies. Protect yourself by not providing confidential information such as user IDs, passwords, social security numbers, credit/debit card numbers, PINs, or account information to unsolicited callers.
